under Chairmanship of Hon Henry Frere. The members were—Hons.
Irenaeus Moe, John Best, John Ince and T. Callender of the Council;
Hon Joshua Gittens, Hon Samuel Walcott, John Stewart, Robert Bur-
nett Jones. Joseph Mayers and John Beckles Esqres of the Assembly.
Petitions were presented from Vestry of St. Michael and Vestry of
St. George for assistance in rebuilding the respective parish churches.
The St. Michael's petition was signed by Thos. Wharton, Rector, Henry
Edey, Churchwarden, S. Walrond, Hy Crichlow, Nathl Trotman, George
Errington, Thomas Maxwell, Richard Redwar, James Fraser, Alured
Popple Duke, Philip Lytcott, Samuel Drayton, Thos McIntosh, Thos.
Woodin, Nathl Weekes, Wm. Firebrace. The petition stated that the
new church would cost £8,000. The St. George's petition was signed
by John Carter, Rector, Edward Ellcock, Johnathan Garner, R. B.
Jones, Alexander Parris Cox, A. Frere, Anthony Barker, Henry Trot-
man, John Clarke, B. T. Jones, William Cragg, John Forster Cox,
