- July 1. *Births*: At Richmond Hill in Grenada on 16 ulto, the wife of D.A.C.G. Major, of a daughter. At Malvern House on 28 ulto the lady of Charles F. Lyall Esq., of a daughter.
- Married*: On 29 May at Bristol by Rev. D. W. Marks, Minister of the West London Synagogue of British Jews, Jacob E. Elkin Esq., of 10, Devonshire Place, Portland Place, London, to Emily, eldest daughter of William W. Alexander Esq: of 20, Berkeley Place, Bristol. On 27 ulto at St. Peter's Church by Rev. H. W. Moore, Rev. George F. Dunn to Miss Elvira S. Clarke, only daughter of the late Gunning Clarke Esq. and daughter-in-law of John Mahon Esq. of Heywoods. Same day at St. Stephen's Chapel by Rev. G. Sealy, Mr. William A. Gittens to Miss Anna Maria Lewis.
- Died*: On 5 ulto at Georgetown, Demerara, age 24 years, Catherine, wife of Rev. Alfred Hothersal Bishop, Curate of St. George's and granddaughter of John Goring Esq. of this island. On 21 ulto, Mr. Ambrose Mashart, aged 39 years. On Wednesday in the Roebuck, Mr. John M'Pherson aged 60 years. On 25 ulto Master Peter Thomas Rebitt aged 3 years 4 months.
- July 4. H.E. Lt. Genl. Sir John Foster Fitzgerald, K.C.B., Colonel of the 18 Royal Regt. who has been appointed Commander of the Forces in the Windward and Leeward Islands Command *vice* Lieut. General Sackville H. Berkeley who has resigned, is expected here by next R.M.C. Steamer on 9 inst.
- July 8. *Married*: On 29 ulto at the Cathedral by Rev. Henry Moore, Curate of St. Peter's parish, Nicholas H. Walrond Esq. to Miss Anna Maria, daughter of the late Thomas Howell Esq. On Friday last in St. George's parish by Rev. C. C. Cummins, Rector, Abel H. Jones, Esq., to Sarah, second daughter of James Craig Kellman. *Died*: On 22 ulto in Pinfold St. aged 50, Miss Charlotte Law, only daughter of the late George Law Esq., formerly merchant of this island.
- July 11. The brig *Cartaretta* from Newfoundland wrecked in Consett's Bay on windward coast with a cargo of fish consigned to George Winter Esq. Captain and crew saved vessel, but cargo lost. A gale at Barbados this morning. Barbados Schr. *Therese* driven on the pier and wrecked; sloop *Jane* of Montserrat grounded on the Half-acre Shoal, but may be saved. At least six other vessels met with loss and damage. The barque *Economist* of London, Capt. Oldbrook, left Liverpool for Barbados on 2 March and capsized in a squall; the Captain and one man taken off the wreck on fifth day and taken to Porto Rico. The two mates and nine men left the ship in the quarter boat and perished. Captain Oldbrook arrived here on the *Medway*.
- July 18. *Married*: At New Haven, U.S.A. on 12 June by Rev. Edward Strong, Winston J. Trowbridge Esq. of the firm of H. Trowbridge & Sons and of the firm of Hayes and Trowbridge in this city, to Mary Dwight, daughter of Rev. Samuel Newton and adopted daughter of Isaac Leavenworth Esq. of New Haven.
